4. Policy Statement

4.1. NASS is committed to preventing acts of modern slavery and human trafficking from occurring in connection with any business activities that it may undertake and in any supply chain. It will do this on a project-by-project basis by enquiry of partner organisations and suppliers.

4.2. NASS does not publish a modern slavery statement under the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (“the Act”) because it does not undertake business activities where the turnover exceeds the relevant threshold (£36 million as at 28/01/25).

4.3. NASS will review the need for compliance with the Act every two years or more frequently if circumstances require.
